


QUESTION: If serving in the United States military, how long before I can naturalize?

ANSWER: Individuals serving in the U.S. military or reserves beginning Sept. 11, 2001, qualify for naturalization regardless of their time in the U.S. Other military veterans qualify after one year permanent residence.
